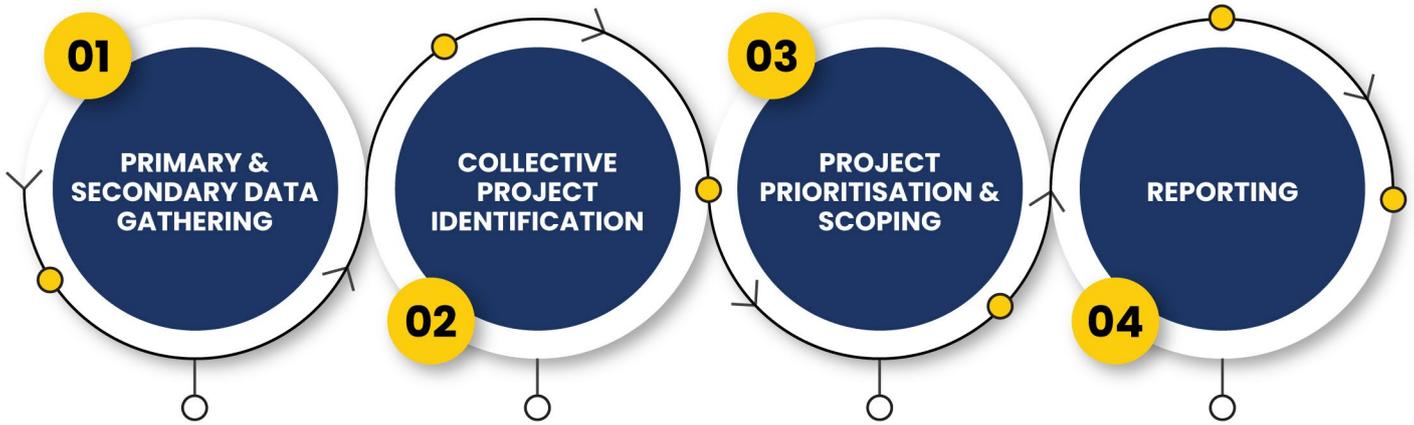

DATA GATHERING & ANALYSIS ACTIVITIES



Secondary Socio-Economic Data

Secondary socio-economic data analysis involves data collection from trusted sources, including the municipality's Integrated Development Plan (IDP), Spatial Development Framework (SDF), Local Economic Development (LED) Strategy, and Statistics South Africa (Stats SA), to establish a baseline understanding of community demographics, economic conditions, and service delivery. This secondary data collection provides valuable insights into community dynamics, informing effective planning and development initiatives.



Key Resourceful People Interviews

Key Resourceful People (KRP) interviews involve structured engagement sessions with influential community stakeholders, including leaders, service providers, business owners, and officials. These in-depth discussions, conducted through face-to-face meetings, telephone calls, or online interactions, provide valuable insights into community dynamics, identifying strengths, opportunities, weaknesses, and challenges. Furthermore, these interviews verify and interpret primary data collected from other sources.



Social Group Interviews

A key tool in our primary data collection involves conducting focus group interviews with diverse social groups (e.g. elderly, entrepreneurs, seasonal workers, unemployed youth, people with disabilities). This ensures inclusive community mapping and effective project planning, and furthermore provides a deeper understanding of marginalised groups' livelihood strategies, vulnerabilities, opportunities, development challenges and needs, and how best to address these.



Community Based Needs Analysis

Based on the 'crossing the river' analogy, community members participate in analysing their current reality, desired future, and potential barriers. This analysis uses a systematic and structured process. The process identifies strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats, informing community-driven development goals and plans. This approach is community-led and participatory, developing self-sustaining solutions that promote community ownership and self-reliance.



Community Based Project Prioritisation

Following the community-based needs analysis, the project prioritisation activity involves a participatory process where community members rank their desired development outcomes and then vote for their top three priorities. This collaborative approach ensures community-driven decision-making, identifying and prioritising the most pressing needs, and aligning project implementation strategies accordingly. Additionally, it ensures local insights and voices shape prioritisation, rather than external perspectives.



Social Risk Register & Mitigation

During the intensive gathering and analysis of primary and secondary data, potential social risks are identified. Furthermore, contextualised mitigation strategies to effectively address these risks are developed. Collaboration with community stakeholders is considered to assess the likelihood and impact, prioritise risks, and design targeted interventions, ensuring the proactive management of social implications and enhancing community ownership and resilience.
